Our daily broadcast at KULA95 includes many excellent Bible programs in English and in Samoan. While English is widely used in the country, so is the Samoan language. With 91% of the people being Samoan, providing Bible programs in the Samoan language is very important. We are blessed to have several capable Samoan men who regularly volunteer themselves to

record radio Bible programs.

While some of these men live here in American Samoa, others live in New Zealand and in Samoa. One of American Samoa's favorite KULA Bible programs is entitled "O e Fa'afofoga Mai?", or "Are You Listening?", with brother Omeka Malila, a local evangelist. The daily Bible lessons are each 17 to 27 minutes long, and include a variety of Bible topics. In each lesson brother Omeka respectfully asks "are you listening friend?", and then invites the audience to begin the Bible study with him. His excellent command of the Samoan language enables him to reach all age groups, in a culture where the manner in which you speak the language is very, very important.

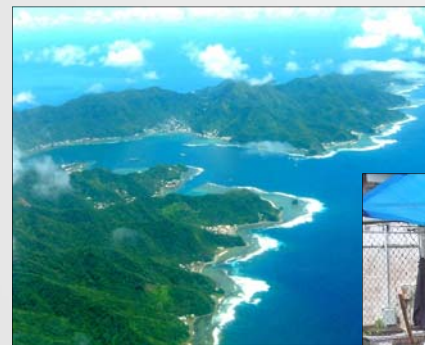
# Pacific Broadcast's FM Network

Far away....in a remote area of the Pacific Islands, exists a growing FM radio station network that the Pacific Broadcast project operates. These stations and fm translators faithfully broadcast the Gospel everyday to remote homes in the villages in which they operate. The broadcasts are reaching people with a very clear message of hope....*hope for this life and life eternal.* God's Word is presented in a way in which *He is always exalted.* When listeners tune to the 24 hour/day broadcast, they learn what is right in the sight of God...and we're there to help them obey God and live faithfully to Him!



At Pacific Broadcast, members of churches of Christ from different nations volunteer their efforts to design, build, and operate a network of stations. Legal, engineering, IT services, construction, and programming work is also being done by volunteers. These volunteer efforts are second to none, and are resulting in a solid foundation being built from which we can reach remote homes with the Gospel. Take for example our daily programming needs for the Pacific Broadcast FM Network – we start with a stringent process in which we carefully review and select content. For our Bible programs, we choose men that *faithfully proclaim His Word, while speaking the Truth in love.* At the end of each broadcast day, we want to know that we have done our very best to insure that God's Word is taught accurately, proclaimed lovingly, and upheld highly. Then, and only then, will God give the increase.

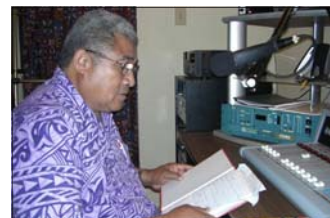

## Pacific Broadcast FM Project Begins Build-out of New Stations

It's with great encouragement that we share with you the exciting news of two new stations that we're starting in American Samoa! In January we will begin installing new transmitters, antenna's, and processing equipment for two full-power fm stations. One of the stations will have a format entirely in English, while the other station will broadcast in the Samoan language, plus other language groups that are present in the country. In American Samoa, we are blessed to have Philippino, Tongan, Fijian, Korean, and Chinese communities. Each of these groups have hard working people who are very active throughout our country. They own businesses, raise families, contribute to the growth of the economy, attend schools, belong to civic groups and various churches. We have also come to learn of their interest in the Bible, and more particularly New Testament Christianity. We believe that by devoting daily broadcast hours to programming in these various languages, we can better serve these local groups and help them to know the true and living God. Although there's a lot of work involved in bringing a new station up and broadcasting, Pacific Broadcast is blessed to have volunteers who are working together with us in this endeavor. Our work will include installing computer and processing equipment in our studios, installing transmitters and antennas on mountain tops, and preparing many hours of Bible content and programming that will be needed for these stations to run each day. Additionally, we are working with members of the churches of Christ (preachers/teachers) from other countries to record lessons in the various languages in which we'll be broadcasting. We thank God for the blessing of these new stations, which will be a great help in "reaching remote homes with the Gospel."
